

Anti-Bullying Policy

1. Statement of Intent

At HB Tuition, we are dedicated to fostering a caring, friendly, and safe environment where all students can learn and grow without fear of bullying. We believe that every individual deserves respect and the opportunity to thrive. Bullying of any kind is unacceptable and will be addressed promptly and effectively.

2. Definition of Bullying

Bullying is the repetitive, intentional harming of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. It can be:

- Emotional: Excluding, tormenting, or spreading rumours.
- Physical: Hitting, kicking, or any use of violence.
- Verbal: Name-calling, sarcasm, or teasing.
- Cyber: Misuse of digital technologies to harm others.

3. Objectives of the Policy

- Ensure all staff, students, and parents understand what bullying is.
- Establish clear procedures for reporting and responding to bullying incidents.
- Support victims of bullying and work with perpetrators to change behaviour.
- Create an environment where bullying is not tolerated.

4. Signs and Symptoms

Staff and parents should be vigilant for signs such as:

- Unexplained injuries or lost possessions.
- Changes in behaviour, such as becoming withdrawn or anxious.
- Declining academic performance.
- Reluctance to attend sessions.

5. Prevention Strategies
